

CONTEXT




SITE ANALYSIS

The key findings of an analysis of current park conditions are that:

- user activities in the park include walking, hiking, viewing, mountain biking, and longboarding
- the park contains a valuable and intact grassland ecosystem that should be protected
- unsanctioned trail creation has caused extensive erosion and damage
- there is high potential for conflicts between hikers/walkers, mountain bikers, long boarders, and vehicles
- the park is lacking certain amenities, including seating, safety guardrails, wayfinding signage, and sufficient designated parking







PROPOSED TRAILS

As a result of the site analysis and discussion with District staff and community stakeholders, the following key changes to the trail system and park amenities are proposed:

reconfigure the trail network, as follows:

400m of new trail
5600m of existing trail to be restored
6600m of redundant or environmentally
damaging trails to be decomissioned

- repair and prevent future erosion by installing crib steps and timber stairs on steepest trails
- create 'The Grind,' a hallmark hiking trail
- separate mountain bike down track trails from hiking and walking trails
- improve parking areas, main entry, and viewpoint access
- provide kiosks at Milne Rd. and upper parking areas with trailhead and park information
- upgrade amenities throughout the park, including benches, wayfinding and educational signage, and safety guardrails





UPPER CIRCULATION

Key changes to the upper end of Giant's Head Mountain Road include:

- providing separate parking and trailhead for mountain bikers at upper parking area
- improving parking and circulation with the use of a one-way road loop at the top of the mountain

























UPPER PARKING AREA

- expanding the upper parking area to prevent erosion and vegetation damage caused by ad-hoc parking
- providing kiosk to guide users to trail types, park features, and regulatory information













MILNE RD. ENTRY



UPPER VIEWPOINT

Improvements to the upper viewpoint include:

- repairing or decommissioning eroded and damaged trails
- constructing crib steps and timber stairs on steepest parts of the main viewpoint trail
- providing a less-steep and stairfree trail to the viewpoint
- installing safety guardrails at viewpoints
- refurbishing existing viewtube features






