- Council adopted the updated Council Policy Manual. The manual had not been updated for many years and was in need of a full review.
- Expenditures from the Climate Action Committee budget were approved by Council. Funds are available for a tree farm (to grow our own trees for parks & boulevards) at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, hot water recycling of the Zamboni machine and for the Bring Back the Bottle (glass, recycling) Project.
- Council had a glimpse of the new District website that is scheduled to go live before the end of the year. This project has been in the works for over a year. The new website will be much more user friendly for both staff and viewers as well as have a more inviting look.
- November 24th marked the final Council meeting for Council elected in 2011. Mayor Perrino, Councillors Bruce Hallquist, Orv Robson, Lloyd Christopherson, Robert Hacking and Marty Van Alphen all had heartfelt goodbye speeches expressing how much they enjoyed their positions, our community, and how proud they were of their many accomplishments over the years.


Be a "Snow Angel" this Winter

SNOW REMOVAL REMINDER

Municipal Bylaws require that you remove the snow and ice from public footpaths and sidewalks bordering your property (business or residential). Any snow or ice that accumulates before noon must be removed by noon that day. If it snows in the afternoon, you have until noon of the next day to remove it. Failure to do so could result in the District having the sidewalk cleaned at your expense. We ask that you use a de-icing agent that contains 'CMA" for sidewalks, please do not use salt as it can cause damage. Please help to keep our sidewalks safe for all that use them.
