## A Few Council Highlights..

## Check our website for full Council Minutes, Agendas and Broadcasts of meetings. Municipal Hall also has paper copies available. Shaw TV broadcasts on Wednesdays and Fridays at 11:00am.

- A zoning bylaw amendment to allow a two lot subdivision on 5818 Nixon Road was adopted.
- 14608 Washington Ave. received approval for a Development Variance Permit for reduced setbacks.
- A Temporary Use Permit Area will be issued to 13415 Lakeshore Drive to allow for the storage of wine barrels.
- The Director of Finance presented financial results as of September 30, 2015 at the November 9th meeting.
- An Environmental Assessment of Prairie Valley West Lands report was received for information and showed there are environmental values on this site. There will be public consultation on potential land uses in the new year.
- A representative from the Regional District Okanagan Similkameen gave a presentation on potential sites for the development of a regional composting facility. Staff was asked to prepare a report on the feasibility of a regional organic facility at the Summerland Landfill.

OOPS! In the November newsletter it was incorrectly reported that the Summerland Credit Union will generously be donating $\$ 5000$ for four large trees for Summerland's parks. It should have stated the contribution would cover eight large trees.

Fire Training Facility
Summerland's firefighters will be able to train and become better prepared for emergencies in our community. The new Fire Training building, located at 9111 Bland Street, is now complete although the entire site will be completed in the spring. Our 3 career and 26 auxiliary members are looking forward to live, realistic training scenarios which will provide excellent training opportunities in structural fires, automobile fires and extrication, natural gas, propane and hazardous material emergencies, confined space rescue and much more. The training structure is constructed from new shipping containers. Once the entire project is complete, there will be a grand opening including a tour.

## Downed Power Line or Communication Lines Call 9-1-1

Residents witnessing power or communication lines that have fallen to the ground or are hanging in the roadway are asked to contact 9-1-1 directly. 9-1-1 will immediately dispatch the Fire Department who will secure the area making it safe for residents until the appropriate personnel can be dispatched to the site. Always assume that downed lines are electrically energized and dangerous regardless of whether they are power, cable, or telephone lines. Keep a safe distance from downed lines and never approach or attempt to move them for any reason.

## Toys and Toonies for Tots and Teens

The Summerland Fire Department and CIBC will be collecting new, unwrapped gifts and toonies for children and teens in Summerland. Make a difference in a child or teen's Christmas. Unwrapped gifts and toonies (to purchase items) can be dropped off at the Fire Hall or CIBC by Friday, December 11th, 2015. Thank you for supporting the children of Summerland!


## Snow Removal Reminder

Municipal Bylaws require that you remove the snow and ice from public footpaths and sidewalks bordering your property (business or residential). Any snow or ice that accumulates before noon must be removed by noon that day. If it snows in the afternoon, you have until noon of the next day to remove it. Failure to do so could result in the District having the sidewalk cleaned at your expense. We ask that you use a deicing agent that contains "CMA" for sidewalks, please do not use salt as it can cause damage. Please help to keep Summerland's sidewalks safe for all that use them.

Watch for the 2016 Curbside Garbage/Recycling/ Yard Waste Calendars that will be mailed out near the end of December. If you opted out of receiving "junk mail" delivery through Canada Post, you will not receive a Calendar, but you can pick one up at Municipal Hall or visit our website. Due to the increasing volume of residential curbside recycling and yard waste, another curbside collection day (Friday) has been added to the schedule and those residents affected will be notified by our contractor, Progressive Waste Solutions.
