How to Use Your Carts

A few tips that will make using your carts even easier:

- All materials must fit within the carts completely with the lids securely closed;
- Find a clearly visible and accessible area to put carts out for collection. Avoid setting carts behind parked cars;
- Do not block bicycle lanes or sidewalks. Carts must not be an obstacle for cyclists and pedestrians;
- To reduce conflicts with wildlife, please do not place your carts out before your collection day and do not store garbage unsecured outside overnight;
- Carts placed in lanes must be placed at ground level in a clearly visible location one metre away from any fence or wall;
- It is recommended to wash your carts from time to time as required to maintain their cleanliness and appearance.

7:00am Collection Time

Please ensure your carts are placed at their designated collection site no later than 7:00am on your scheduled collection day.

Cart Placement

Park your cart on the street, with the wheels against the curb, or on the shoulder (if no curb). Point the arrow on the cart lid towards the street.



Spacing – Leave a Buffer

Place your cart so that there is at least 1m (3ft) of space on all sides and 3m (10ft) of clearance above. Do not park vehicles within 1.5m (5ft) of cart.

Retrieving Emptied Carts

When emptied, please remove the carts from the street or shoulder and return them to a safe/secured spot on your property.

Collection Solutions

Waste Not Collected?

Not having all your items picked up can be frustrating, but there is often an explanation.

Common reasons for items being left behind:

- Carts must be spaced a minimum of 1m (3ft) away from each other, and 1.5m (5ft) from any obstacles such as vehicles or trees;
- Items not set out on time (must be at the curb by 7:00am on scheduled collection day);
- Cart is overfilled or lid is not closed;
- Presence of prohibited waste;
- Contamination of recyclables with garbage or yard waste; ٠
- Contamination of yard waste with garbage or recyclables;
- Carts not accessible or hidden from view;
- Recycling or yard waste not scheduled for collection that particular week.

Find the Right Fit

Are you exceeding the capacity of any of your carts? Are you finding any cart is too large for your needs?

There are different sizes available for all three carts: 120L, 240L, 360L.

All cart size changes are subject to an administration fee. Increased sizes for garbage or yard waste have an additional annual fee. Larger recycling carts are free!

Residents can decrease their cart sizes at any time with no additional cost. Additionally, if you have little to no yard waste and would like to return your cart, it can be picked up at no cost.

To avoid the need to upsize your carts, residents are encouraged to:

- Compact your materials as much as possible before placing them into the bins Crush milk jugs
- Break down boxes
- Consider ways to reduce waste
- Choose products with less packaging
- Donate good condition items
- Take advantage of the many recycling programs available at the Summerland Landfill Recycling Depot
- Grasscycle (leave cut grass on the lawn also reduces fertilizer and water use!)
- Compost yard waste by itself, or you may add kitchen scraps
- Reuse or repurpose where possible

Excess Yard and Garden Waste For properties which produce lots of yard and garden waste

A 360L cart is available for Yard and Garden waste. This cart holds the equivalent of 3-4 completely full large Kraft bags (110L). If you have more material than fits in the cart one week, several options exist:

- Extra material can be held back until the next scheduled yard and garden waste pick up (every 2 weeks between March and December).
- Residents can drop off loads of up to 500kg of yard waste at the Summerland landfill at no charge.
- Yard and garden waste tag-a-bags can be purchased and affixed to approved customer-supplied containers weighing up to 25kg: Kraft bags; rigid plastic or galvanized metal cans up to 95L; Cart-type containers capable of being automatically lifted by the Contractor's collection vehicle; bundles of tree trimmings or prunings cut to a maximum of 1m (3ft) in length and securely tied with twine or string.

Residents are encouraged to grasscycle and to compost their yard and garden waste, keeping nutrients on site and reducing water use!

Moving? Cart Damaged? Carts are District of Summerland Property

If you sell your property and move, or give up tenancy, your carts shall remain at the property. If you purchase a house and would like to change the cart sizes that exist, you can request a change by visiting Municipal Hall at 13211 Henry Avenue.

Please note that changes to the cart sizes can only be authorized by the registered property owner. Also note that some changes to cart sizes are subject to fees. Please consult the most recent Fees and Charges Bylaw for pricing.

If your cart is damaged and requires repairs, contact Waste Connections of Canada at 250-490-3888.

Extra Garbage or Yard Waste?

Display a Tag-a-Bag sticker clearly on each extra bag over the cart limit. Place at the curb along with your cart on your regular collection day.

Curbside Collection Recycling Guide

Recycling is collected **every other week** marked in **blue** on the calendar.

No need to sort – simply place these items in your recycling cart.



Newspaper & Newspaper inserts

Newspapers and newspaper inserts, including advertising flyers



Mixed Paper

Magazines, catalogues & inserts

Office/computer paper & envelopes (window style accepted)

Gift cards & non-foil wrap (incl. paper flower wrap)

Phone books

Paper bags (grocery, lunch bags, prescription bags)

Shredded paper: accepted only if inside a firmly tied, **clear** plastic bag and placed in recycle cart.



Accepted Items & How to Prepare

Boxboard & Cardboard

Boxes for cereal, tissues, shoes, pizza, laundry detergent, etc.

Box trays for bottled water, soft drinks, cans, etc. (Recycle plastic overwrap at depot)

Cardboard rolls from toilet paper and paper towel

Cardboard egg cartons

Take-out beverage trays

Paper-based flower pots

Flatten and place directly in recycle cart (do not bundle beside carts).



Corrugated Cardboard

Clean, dry cardboard (unwaxed)

Pizza boxes: remove food debris and liner

Staples and packing tape are accepted.

Flatten and place in recycle cart.

ONLY cardboard placed inside of recycle cart will be collected.

RECYCLEBC

Recycle BC is a not-for-profit organization responsible for residential packaging and paper recycling throughout British Columbia. Recycle BC ensures packaging and paper is collected from households and recycling depots, sorted and recycled responsibly. The Recycle BC program is funded by over 1,200 businesses, like retailers, manufacturers and restaurants, that supply packaging and printed paper to BC residents, to shift recycling costs away from homeowners. Recycle BC was originally launched in 2014 as Multi-Material BC (MMBC).

Metal Tins / Cans Aluminum Foil / Cans

Aluminum or steel cans for food, pet food, etc.

Aluminum foil and foil containers including foil take-out containers

Metal-rimmed spiral cardboard containers for frozen juice, dough, potato chips, baby formula, etc.

Empty and rinse. Drop lid into can and squeeze top slightly. Labels and lids accepted.

Take deposit return items to a bottle depot.



Plastic Bottles, Jugs, Jars & Cups

Clean, dry plastics with hard sides including:

- plastic bottles & jars for food, soap, shampoo, household cleaners, laundry products, vitamins & pills, cosmetics, etc.
- plastic jugs for cooking oil, milk, detergent, cleaning products, windshield washer, etc.
- plastic cold beverage cups
- single-use coffee pods

(remove lids, empty grounds) Spray, pump and pull-up tops accepted. Remove lids and/or spray tops and recycle separately in recycle cart.

Empty and rinse thoroughly.



Plastic Tubs, Trays & Clamshells

Clean, dry plastics with hard sides including:

- clamshells for baked goods, fruit, eggs, etc.
- tubs & pails for margarine, dairy products (yogurt, sour cream, ice cream, etc.), detergent, etc.
- **trays** for deli chicken, single-serve meals, prepared foods
- microwaveable bowls/cups
- housewares and hardware
 packaging, including for screws,
 picture hangers, etc.
- plastic garden pots and trays
- containers with clear or black bottom with clear domes

Empty and rinse containers. Recycle lids separately in recycle cart.



Aerosol Cans & Caps

Aerosol spray cans

for food, air fresheners, shaving cream, hair spray, deodorant, etc.

Empty cans only. Remove caps and recycle separately in recycle cart.

- NO cans with any contents postable' remaining inside (recycle at depot)
 - NO spray paint cans (recycle at depot)
 - NO propane cylinders (recycle at depot)

NO cans with 'Poison', 'Combustible', or 'Danger' symbols (recycle at depot)

NO Co2 cartridges

NO butane (recycle at depot - only if punctured)

NO furniture spray polish (recycle at depot)

NO automotive products

Bags & overwrap from garden products, water softener & road salt; mattresses, furniture and electronics



Polystyrene **Foam Packaging**

Foam containers and trays, including meat, egg cartons, take-out clamshells, cups and bowls

Moulded foam cushion packaging for protecting electronics, small appliances, etc.

Empty and rinse food containers. Remove liners and plastic wrap from meat /food trays.

White and coloured foam products must be separated
