

## Mayor's Report November 9, 2020

I begin the Mayor's Report by again congratulating Dan Ashton on his success in being re-elected as MLA in the Penticton riding. Thank you to Dan, Ted Shumaker and Keith MacIntyre for putting their names forward for their respective parties. Although I was hoping to be in the position to serve Summerland and surrounding communities in a different capacity, I am very pleased to again take up the duties and responsibilities of the Mayor's role. Thanks to Councillor Carlson and Councillor Holmes for stepping in as acting mayor during my leave of absence.

On October 29 I was honoured to be invited to attend a special assembly at Giant's Head School to celebrate the School's new logo. It depicts a story about Giant's Head Mountain that tells of determination and overcoming adversity as told by Anona Kampe, who has been working with the School to further Syilx cultural understandings. After the ceremony, I had a brief discussion with newly-elected Penticton Indian Band Chief Greg Gabriel. We will resume efforts to strengthen the relationship between our two Councils in the New Year.

Because of the pandemic, this year's Remembrance Day service will look quite different. Much like Canada Day, we are unable to have a large gathering in Memorial Park.
