

## CAO Report – February 6, 2024

Some positive progress on the Summerland Pier in the last week. As per the provincial process the Penticton Indian Band was engaged to see if they have any site-specific concerns. We received back a letter of conditional approval from the PIB in a quick turnaround which is greatly appreciated! We are now waiting for the province to provide their final authorizations to put in the piles which we hope can still be done within the environmental working window they have given us. If those approvals do not come through in time, it is likely the project will not be able to be built until the late summer or fall.

Speaking of the pier, Summerland Rotary has announced a second 50/50 draw. The first round of the 50/50 fundraiser raised \$31,390, with the winner taking a total of \$15,695! The overall goal is for the Summerland Rotary Club to raise up to \$100,000 for the enhancement of the new pier, with additional funds to come from the community at large. Ticket sales are open now and close February 28 – check out the Summerland Rotary website to learn more.

A couple of public engagement opportunities are coming up on some key projects, so I wanted folks to be aware of the timelines:
