LAKESHORE PATHWAY

Summerland is interested in exploring the feasibility of a lakeshore pathway connecting Summerland to Penticton.

The District will participate in a study coordinated by the Ministry of Transportation (MoT) to determine costs, interest and advantages to developing a walking/biking trail between the two communities.

The cost of the study is \$120,000 with the MoT contributing 2/3 of the costs and Summerland and the other partners portion being \$13,333 each. This amount will come out of our reserve account designated for trails. Participation at this point is to gain information and has no obligation to develop the trail.

FORMER RCMP BUILDING

At a Special Meeting of Council a decision was made to sell the former RCMP lands at 8709 Jubilee Road.

The property has been vacant since 2012 and several proposals have ended without success. It is currently zoned to accommodate a cluster of single detached houses.

The District is looking forward to seeing the property developed as quickly as possible.

TRANS CANADA TRAIL UPGRADES

The District will submit a funding application for the Trans Canada Trail Upgrade at Fenwick Road to BikeBC. If the application is successful, it will provide funding assistance for upgrades to the Trans Canada Trail at Fenwick Road access including:

- Re-grade the trail, place gravel and establish a consistent 3.0m trail width
- Pave 270m of trail from the trailhead
- Re-grade and pave 150m of Fenwick Rd from Fyffe Rd to the trailhead and mark a bicycle lane

The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$80,000. With grant funding, the District would be responsible for 50% or \$40,000.

DOGGONE IT!

The temporary period that dogs can be off leash at Peach Orchard Park will come to an end April 30th. Dogs are required to be leashed at all times in parks (unless they are enjoying a swim at the Doggie Beach).

Dogs will again be allowed to be without a leash at Peach Orchard Park starting October 1st.



2016 SPRING IRRIGATION SERVICES

The District will begin turning on irrigation services Monday, April 11, 2016. Irrigators who wish to have their irrigation turned on prior to this will be required to pay a \$44.00 fee and submit a completed Advance Irrigation application to the District. Applications are available at Works and Utilities, 9215 Cedar Avenue, Monday to Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

NOTE: Irrigation rates will continue to be billed as they have been in the past as a flat rate per acre. To encourage water conservation, an inclining penalty for usage over 800mm will be implemented. Rates are yet to be determined but will be decided shortly.

Rates for properties that have second services are still under review. More information will follow.

SUMMERLAND LANDFILL

The public is reminded that all loads being taken to the landfill must be secured and covered. Loads that are not secured and covered will be charged double the regular tipping fee. Please keep our roads free from debris. Your assistance is appreciated! The Summerland Landfill is located at 17202 Bathville Road and is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. Monday to Saturday, closed Sundays and Statutory holidays. For further details on what items are accepted at the landfill, charges, or information on premium compost, please visit our website.

AN EQUAL PAYMENT PLAN MAY HELP YOU BUDGET

Having a set monthly utility payment each month helps customers manage their expenses. Utility bills are averaged out based on your last year and given a set payment amount each month. To be eligible for this payment plan you must sign up by April 22, 2016 as equal payments will begin in May. Funds will be withdrawn from your account automatically on the due date (receive the discount every month!). Accounts will be reviewed April 30th of each year and modified if needed.
