WATER ZONING OPEN HOUSE Tuesday, August 16, 2016 5pm - 8pm with a Presentation at 7pm Council Chambers, Municipal Hall

The District of Summerland municipal boundary extends 600ft (183m) out into Okanagan Lake. Zoning generally stops at the high water mark and does not currently extend into the lake.

Council may consider placing zoning over the water to the municipal boundary. This will help regulate docks, mooring buoys and use of the lake for recreational purposes.

Three water zones are being contemplated:

- WZ1 extends from the shore out to the 100m mark in front of residential properties. Docks and mooring buoys are allowed.
- WZ2 extends from the 100m mark out to the municipal boundary in front of residential properties. Docks and mooring buoys are not allowed.
- WZ3 is located in front of commercial areas such as the marina and Waterfront Resort as well as local beaches. Water related commercial use, docks and mooring buoys are allowed.

The final design for Summerland's Skatepark is now complete (see above). Many thanks to the community members who provided input on the design. Work on the final drawings and budget for the next step, tendering the construction, is underway. The new skatepark will be located on the southwest corner of Rosedale Avenue and Jubilee Road West, just east of Summerland Middle School.

The construction for the skatepark could begin in spring/summer 2017 if fund raising goals (approximately \$600,000) are achieved. By September, the District should receive word if the application for over \$300,000 from the Canada 150 Infrastructure Grant was successful. Our community has contributed over \$135,000 to date.

SUMMERLAND HEALTHY COMMUNITY INITIATIVE

The District of Summerland is partnering with Interior Health to increase the actions that will improve the health of our community by reducing chronic disease and obesity. The Summerland Healthy Community Initiative (SHCI) was created with a goal to make Summerland a leading example of a healthy community and to bring awareness and promote healthy living. So far this group has been involved with Bike Anywhere Week, held discussions at a Philosopher's Café, hosted a public meeting and conducted a survey to hear from the community.

Funds recently received from a provincial grant will be used to provide a series of free films and community conversations about health. Topics to be covered will include food security, senior's health, childhood development, agriculture, and mental health. Everyone is invited to join in the conversation and spark projects to promote health in Summerland.



HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Works Division will begin annual hydrant flushing on August 15th from 7:30 am to 3:00 pm, Monday to Friday until mid-October. This annual maintenance ensures that hydrants are in good working condition in case of emergencies.

Residents may experience lower than normal water flow for a short period of time when flushing is being performed in your area. This may also cause water to be discoloured. If this occurs, please run a cold water tap or an outside hose until water runs clear. Avoid using your washing machine from 7:30 am to 3:00 pm as discoloured water can stain clothes. Check water for clarity after 3:00 pm. Watch for crews working in your area.
