

A BOBSLED FOR SUMMERLAND

Council made a decision to honour our hometown Olympic gold medal winner Justin Kripps by purchasing an authentic bobsled to have as an attraction in Summerland.

Justin Kripps grew up in Summerland and at the 2018 Winter Games in PyeongChan, South Korea he piloted his two-man bobsled to win an Olympic Gold medal.

Residents and tourists can climb into the sled and experience what it feels like to sit in one. This four-man sled is one of the first sleds Justin competed in.

For now the bobsled is located in front of the Aquatic and Fitness

Centre until a permanent home is determined. A plaque to honour Justin Kripps is being designed to go with the bobsled.

OTHER FLEXIBLE PLASTIC PACKAGING

Starting January 1, 2019 the District will be accepting *Other Flexible Plastic Packaging* for recycling at the Summerland Sanitary Landfill Recycling Depot. Other Flexible Plastic Packaging material must be separate from other recyclable materials accepted at the Recycling Depot and cannot be placed in your blue curbside recycling cart.

Acceptable Other Flexible Plastic Packaging include: Zipper Lock & Stand-Up Pouches, Crinkly Wrappers, Bars & Bags, Flexible Packaging with Plastic Seal, Woven & Net Plastic Bags, Non-Food Protective Packaging.

Unacceptable Material: Plastic Squeeze Tubes, Plastic-lined Paper, Paper-lined Plastic, 6pack Rings, Plastic



Strapping, Biodegradable Plastic and PVC/Vinyl

SNOW REMOVAL

Please help our snow removal crew by parking your vehicle(s) off the road. When clearing your driveway, stockpile snow on the right side when facing the road. This prevents the snow you removed from being ploughed back in front of your driveway. Thank you for your cooperation!



DOG AND BUSINESS LICENCE

RENEWALS will be mailed out in the middle of December and are due January 31, 2019. If you do not receive your renewal in the mail or if you no longer require a dog or business

licence, please call Municipal Hall 250-494-6451 or send an email to info@summerland.ca.

SIDEWALK CLEARING

Municipal bylaws require that you remove the snow and ice from public footpaths and sidewalks bordering your property (business or residential). Any snow or ice that accumulates before noon must be removed by noon that day. If it snows in the afternoon, you have until noon of the next day to remove it. Failure to do so could result in the District having the sidewalk cleaned at your expense. We ask that you use a de-icing "CMA" for sidewalks, please do not use salt as it can cause damage. Please help to keep Summerland's sidewalks safe for all that use them.

CURBSIDE CART SIZE CHANGES

The curbside collection cart change-outs are now current. If you have put in a request to change one or more of your carts and the change has not yet occurred please contact the Works and Utilities office at 250-494-0431.

December 31, 2018 will be the last day that residents may change the sizes of any number of carts, **one time**, without paying the switch-out administration fee (\$30). Please note that requests for certain changes may incur other fees (such as upsizing garbage carts).
