# **Please Water Wisely**

The Province has moved the Okanagan to a Level 3 drought rating as a precautionary measure based on low snowpack and dry conditions. The concern is for small water systems that draw from streams and have little storage. It is understood that Provincial Drought Levels do not translate into municipal levels as each system is different. Although snowpack levels were low in the District's watershed, the reservoirs filled and Thirsk Reservoir stopped spilling on June 14 which means that we are now in storage. The District continues to be in Stage 1 water restrictions and asks that residents use water responsibly to help mitigate the need for further restrictions. The status of the District's water storage is evaluated frequently and changes may occur at any time.

# Stage One Watering Restrictions

Please continue to check the District website www.summerland.ca to see if any changes occur. Currently the District is in Stage One Watering Restrictions.

If your address is odd (the last digit ends in 1,3,5,7,9) you may water on Saturday, Monday and Thursday. If your address is even (ends in 0,2,4,6,8) you may water on

Sunday, Tuesday and Friday.

If you have an **underground sprinkler system**, you may water from midnight to 6:00am on your permitted days (either odd or even). Micro-irrigation, drip irrigation or a hose with a I shutoff nozzle can be used anytime to water trees, shrubs or veggies.

If you are planting new sod or seed and need to water more, please visit Municipal Hall for a Special Watering Permit.

Although the District is in Stage One and residents are allowed to water throughout the day on their scheduled day, we ask people to water wisely and try to water between dusk and dawn if possible.

# Tips to Save Energy, Save Money and Keep Cool

Here are a few tips to help you stay cool this summer:

- Close doors and windows tightly when running your air conditioner.
- Use ceiling fans instead of air conditioning.
- Make sure your fan is blowing air downward (counter-clockwise) in the summer.
- Change or clean the air filter on your air conditioner at least once a month and keep unit well maintained.
- Raise the temperature setting on your air conditioner, you can save 7-10% of your cooling costs for each degree above 25°C.
- Install ENERGY STAR® qualified ceiling fans. In combination with energy efficient lighting, these units are about 50% more efficient than conventional fan/light units.
- When replacing your air conditioner, choose an ENERGY STAR® qualified model. Make sure you don't buy a bigger unit than you need. An oversized air conditioner is actually less effective.

#### **SEWER MAIN FLUSHING**

The Works Division is performing annual sewer main flushing throughout Summerland from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm, Monday to Friday for the next two months. This annual



maintenance ensures that sewer mains are working properly. Please use caution when driving by Crews working on the road. We apologize for any inconvenience and thank you for your cooperation.

#### **Property Taxes**

Any outstanding property taxes or homeowner grants will be charged a 10% penalty.

Hot Diggity Dog - Please do not leave dogs/pets inside vehicles during the hot weather. Even for a short time, temperatures can get very high in vehicles and can be hazardous to pets.

**Scoop the Poop** - Please be a responsible dog owner and pick up after your dog. The District has many doggie bag containers around town to help keep Summerland nice and clean.
