Changes to Curbside Collection - Cart Service Starts July 1, 2018 (Garbage, Recycling, Yard Waste)

As of July 1, 2018, Summerland Curbside Collection will switch to carts rather than bags for garbage, recycling and yard waste.

In June, a set of three carts will be delivered to households receiving curbside collection services for garbage, recycling, and yard waste. The set includes: 120L Garbage, 240L Recycling, 240L Yard Waste.

Options will be available to increase or decrease the cart sizes following a 3 month trial period (July 1-September 30) during which households must use the provided set of carts. From October 1-December 1, residents may change the sizes of any number of carts, one time, at no cost. Any changes requested after the initial 3 months will be subject to a fee, except for new home owners / tenants who will be allowed to revert to the base set at no cost.



Samples of the carts are on display at Municipal Hall and at the Summerland Arena for residents to view and try out. Come to Municipal Hall or the Arena to see the various sizes and how easy they are to move!

Council is committed to providing as much assistance as possible to make the transition to carts easy and straightforward. Residents with questions regarding a unique situation with their specific property or circumstance will be handled one-on-one by District staff.

More details about the cart program will be announced shortly, but here are some commonly asked questions:

Q: Why is Summerland moving to a cart program?

A: Carts provide several benefits, including safety of workers, faster (and therefore less expensive and less polluting) pickups, and ease of use for customers (wheels). RecycleBC will no longer allow the use of blue bags in 2020, and carts are a more cost effective and environmentally friendly solution than other options.

Q: Is there a cost for the carts?

A: The carts are part of the District's new collection service agreement, and their cost is covered in the monthly service fee on your utility bill.

Q: Will there be changes as to what can be recycled?

A: No. The materials that can be recycled at the curbside will remain the same. Items such as glass, styrofoam, plastic bags and overwrap, electronics, and household hazardous waste must still be taken to the landfill depot.

Q: Do I need to use bags anymore?

A: Garbage must be kept in bags (small white bags are recommended). Recycling must be loose (no bags). Yard waste must be loose (no bags).

Q: Can I opt out of the curbside program?

A: No. As with the existing garbage, recycling, and yard waste collection service, households currently receiving curbside collection must participate.

A Beautiful Yard Doesn't Happen By Itself

Spring is just around the corner, and it's time to start thinking about keeping our yards and gardens beautiful. There are several ways you can help keep your green spaces looking lovely:

Compost



Compost is food for your plants, trees, and grass. It also helps hold water in the soil, balances soil pH, and improves soil structure. You can make your own compost or purchase finished compost at the Summerland landfill. Bring your own containers/bags and shovel and pay only 2 cents per kilogram (minimum charge \$2.00). If you need a pickup truck load...no problem, we'll load your truck, approximately \$20.00 per pickup load. The landfill also has green wood mulch, white wood/apple box mulch and top dressing for sale for 2 cents per kilogram. Trucks and trailers can be loaded between 9:00 am and 2:45 pm.

COMPOSTERS FOR SALE - You can make your own compost with a Compost Bin available through the District **for only \$46 + tax**. Order yours at Municipal Hall <u>before</u> March 21, and pick them up starting on Earth Day (April 22).

Tidy Up - Yard Waste Collection Begins this Month

For materials that can't be composted at home (branches, weeds, etc.), and for those who don't compost, yard waste collection service starts again the week of March 6, on your regular garage collection day. Until July 1, you can place your yard waste in large kraft paper bags or containers marked with a "Yard Waste Only" decal (decals free at Municipal Hall). Containers or kraft bags must not exceed 25kg (55lbs). Bundles of prunings may be tied with string or twine, not to exceed 1 metre (3 ft) in length. After July 1, yard waste will be collected via curbside carts. See the front page of this newsletter for more information.
