### Lifeguards Recognized for Lifesaving Actions

District of Summerland staff and Council recognized the heroic efforts of three lifeguards recently.

Aysha Curley, Micaela MacDougall and Anna Lock were presented plagues and received praise for their quick response to a major first aid incident which took place on January 31, 2020 at the Summerland Aquatic & Fitness Centre.

The Lifeguards attended to a fitness class patron who was not feeling well. While monitoring vitals, the patron slid from dizzy, to unconscious and then to no pulse. The Lifeguards immediately performed CPR and the patron regained consciousness prior to the AED (automated external defibrillator) being administered. The lifeguards continued to care for the patron until the ambulance arrived and the patron was taken to the hospital.

The patron is now at home recovering and is looking forward to returning to the fitness program.

### What's Happening in Development Services?

The Development Services team have seen a busy start to the year with \$3,484,000 worth of construction activity being approved in January and February. 21 new Building Permits were issued and 10 new development applications were received in the first two months of the year. After a record 2019 year of construction, the Development Services team are looking forward to another positive year for our construction industry .

### **Budget 2020 Update**

Thank you to everyone who attended the District's Community Open House on February 12th. Council and staff had the opportunity to hear from the community as they finalized the budgeting process for 2020.

Community engagement also commenced for some long term priorities for our community including:

- The Summerland Community Health & Wellness Centre, including Aquatic Centre replacement where feedback was provided identifying future needs for this facility.
- Downtown Plan supporting investment, vibrancy and growth ensuring long term sustainable growth and development of the downtown neighbourhood.
- Affordable Housing Forum to identify opportunities for future partnerships to increase the supply of housing in the community.
- Asset management and infrastructure investment including creation of a capital project prioritization tool to assist in the decision making process.
- The implementation of the District's Parks and Recreation Master Plan, where the community provided feedback on the proposed dog park, pickle ball and tennis court priorities.

### **Summerland Recognized for Climate Action**

The District has achieved Milestone 1 of the FCM-ICLEI Partners for



Climate Protection Program Milestone Framework for both the community as a whole, and for the Corporation. The Program empowers municipalities to take action against climate change through a fivemilestone process that guides members in creating GHG inventories, setting realistic and achievable GHG reduction targets, developing local action plans, and

implementing plans using specific, measurable actions to reduce emissions. With the impending completion of the updated Community and Corporate Energy & Emissions Reduction Plans, staff expect to achieve Milestone 3 for both plans in 2020, and Milestone 5 in 2021.

Bring your sorted glass jars/non-refundable bottles, styrofoam, plastic bags and overwrap,

other flexible plastic packaging, residential batteries and lightbulbs, electronics, TV's and small appliances to the Summerland Arena Recycling Compound and help us keep recyclables out of our landfill.

Staff will be on hand to answer questions on how to sort and place your recyclable materials.

It appears 'Spring has Sprung'. Many residents are busy preparing their yards for the warmer months to come. Yard & Garden Waste collection has restarted. Pickup will be on your regular garbage day.

- Pickup is bi-weekly, alternating with Recycling collection, on your scheduled collection day;
- Please have your Yard & Garden waste along with your Garbage to the curb and properly spaced by 7:00 am;
- If you have more Yard & Garden waste then will fit it your green cart you can:
  - Bring it to the Landfill. Yard Waste is free up 500kg;
  - Purchase 'tag-a-bag' stickers from Municipal Hall or Works & Utilities for \$2.50, and place them on a container or bag, with the sticker clearly visible. Put the bag/container out beside your Yard & Garden Waste cart; and/or
  - Change the size of your Yard & Garden Waste cart. The carts are available in 120L, 240L (base size), and 360L sizes. Changeout form is located on the District website.

### **Secure your Landfill Loads**

The public is reminded that all loads being taken to the Summerland Sanitary Landfill must be secured and covered. Loads that do not meet these requirements will be charged double the rate for garbage or double the highest rate for any material contained in the load, whichever is greater, with a minimum charge of \$10.00. The Landfill is open 8:30am - 4:15pm Monday to Saturday, closed Sundays and Statutory holidays. Compost is available for purchase at the landfill!
