### Parks and Recreation Master Plan

The District of Summerland is looking for community feedback on the recently released key findings and recommendations for the draft Parks and Recreation Master Plan. An Open House will take place May 9th from 5:00pm—8:00pm at the Arena Banquet Room.

The Master Plan is a shared vision for Summerland's parks and recreation. A Plan should addresses demands, reflect community values and priorities and ensure high quality parks and recreation facilities.

A dedicated group of volunteers have worked with a consultant since the summer of 2017 when the first open house and survey were presented to the community before the Draft was created. Once feedback is reviewed, it is expected that the final Parks & Recreation Master Plan will be presented to Council at the end of June.



### **High Creek Water Levels**

Aeneas Creek continues to experience high water flows. The District took all possible action to release as much water from Garnet Dam earlier this year resulting in the lowest level of water in over 20 years coming into this spring freshet. Despite these steps, Aeneas Creek continues to experience very high water flows and has breached the banks in numerous places.

- Check District of Summerland website (www.summerland.ca) or Facebook page (@SummerlandBC) for up to date information on flood threats;
- Empty sandbags are available for pickup at the Fire Hall and sand piles have been deposited in numerous places along the creek;
- Residents should refrain from contacting individual District staff members
  directly with questions regarding the high water. All questions should be
  directed to the flood inquiry line at 250-486-3765; if it is an emergency
  situation, please call 9-1-1 and appropriate crews will respond.
- The District has identified several areas most vulnerable to failure due to rising waters. These areas are being fortified with large sand berms and other barriers. Although it may be interesting to see the effects of the flood, everyone is asked to stay OFF these berms. Movement on the berms could cause a shift and put the public in danger should the water become uncontained.
- A large snowpack remains; water could continue to rise.
- Lake levels remain significantly lower than last year.

Sand berms and other barriers are constructed to keep moving water contained and to keep the public safe. Please DO NOT stand, walk or climb on these structures as this may cause them to be altered and allow the water to breach.

### Recycling Roundup = Big Results

During Earth Week, Summerland residents were invited to drop off of non-curbside recycling and household hazardous waste at no cost to a special one-day collection event. Thanks to our conscientious community members, over 12,600L of hazardous chemicals, 1720L of paint, 392kg of small appliances, 214 florescent tubes, 45kg of household batteries, over 2m³ of plastic wrap/bags, and MORE were kept out of our landfill! Thank you to the volunteers from Summerland Steam and SADI for your assistance.

### Water schedule

While some areas near creeks in Summerland are experiencing flooding, other areas are dry and will begin watering their lawns.

Summerland is in Stage One Watering Restrictions unless otherwise notified.

If your address is **odd** (the last digit ends in 1,3,5,7,9) you may water on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>Monday and Thursday</u>.

If your address is **even (**ends in 0,2,4,6,8) you may water on <u>Sunday, Tuesday and Friday</u>.

If you have an underground sprinkler system, you may water from midnight to 6:00am on your permitted days (either odd or even). Micro-irrigation, drip irrigation or a hose with a shutoff nozzle can be used anytime to water trees, shrubs or veggies. If you are planting new sod or seed and need to water more, please visit Municipal Hall about a Special Watering Permit.
