Preferred Site Identified for Solar+Storage Project

Council has selected the prime potential location for Summerland's Solar+Storage Project – a grant-funded 1 Megawatt solar array with 2 Megawatts of battery storage.

Summerland's project is unique to the Okanagan and is just one step in the District's plan to implement sustainable initiatives that make the community more resilient.

Following a review of all District-owned properties, the District's former Public Works yard & storage area located at 13500 Prairie Valley Road/12591 Morrow Ave/Denike Street was found to offer the best balance of appropriate zoning and long-term land use, environmental protection and available co-benefits.



A large portion of the site has been previously disturbed, including a large paved section with removed trees and foliage. The project provides an opportunity to remediate these impacts and to return the disturbed area of the site to productive use.

Due to its raised elevation and topography, the proposed site is generally not visible from the lower elevation residential and rural areas which surround the site, and the visual impacts are considered minor.

As the site area is highly valued for recreational uses, one of the potential co-benefits of the project is the possibility to add recreational amenities such as parking, maps, and picnic benches.

A detailed review of the site conditions and confirmation of the site-specific costs and considerations is currently underway and will provide the information needed to finalize the site planning and design.

Make your Home "Unbearable"

Now that bears are awakening from their winter slumber, it is time to bear proof yards. Once a bear becomes used to human food sources it becomes

habituated, usually resulting in the bear being destroyed. Here are some household tips:

- Garbage properly secure garbage and keep it indoors until pick-up or until you can bring it to the landfill. <u>Place your carts at the curb no earlier than</u> 5:00am on your scheduled collection day. Consider upgrading to a wildlife cart.
- Compost

 properly care for your compost by turning it and layering it appropriately to reduce odours.
- Fruit Trees and Grapes- make sure to harvest fruit immediately.
- Pet food, Birdfeeders and Gardens are all attractants for bears. Keep your pet food securely stored indoors.
- Barbeques— limit smells by keeping your barbeques properly cleaned and covered.

Dogs will again be allowed to be without a leash at Peach Orchard Park starting October 1st.

Summerland is in Stage One Watering Restrictions

Unless otherwise notified - Summerland is in Stage One. If your address is **odd** (the last digit ends in 1,3,5,7,9) you may water on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>Monday and Thursday</u>. If your address is **even (**ends in 0,2,4,6,8) you may water on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>Tuesday and Friday</u>.

If planting new sod or seed, please visit Municipal Hall about a Special Watering Permit.

No Signs Please

Please be reminded that the District of Summerland does not permit permanent or temporary signs to be placed in the roundabouts, on power poles or light standards or anywhere within highway rights-of-way, unless expressly permitted in Sign Bylaw No. 2013-026. The District may remove and impound any sign on District road rights-of-way that is in contravention with this Bylaw.

Snowpack Update

As of May 1 there is no snow remaining at the Headwaters or the Isintok Snow Survey Sites. Although no snow remains, the reservoirs continue to fill and many are either spilling or near spilling at this time. The District is confident that all District reservoirs will reach maximum storage.

Electrical Safety Day—May 16

Get ready for Electrical Safety Day, taking place in schools across B.C. on May 16. This annual initiative promotes electrical safety awareness so students have the tools to spot a hazard and know exactly what to do to stay safe around electricity.

With safety being a priority for the District, Summerland electrical staff will be on hand in schools on May 16 to go over the Electrical Safety Day video provided by BC Hydro.

Utility Bill Equal Payment Plan

If you are currently on the utility bill equal payment plan, April is the reconciliation month. The total amount due on your April invoice will reflect the difference between the utility charges to date and the monthly payments received.

If the account has been under paid, the payment will be automatically withdrawn from your bank account on the May 29th due date to bring the utility account balance to zero. If the account has been overpaid, your account will have a credit "- amount" which will carry over to next month's invoice.

The June utility invoice will reflect your new recalculated equal payment amount.
