Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM)

Mayor and Council had a busy, productive week at the annual UBCM conference held recently in Vancouver. The conference provides a great opportunity for elected officials, Chief Administrative Officers and staff to unite, cooperate, discuss and learn about matters that affect municipal government and their citizens. It also provides a

chance to meet one on one with provincial ministers and staff on topics related to Summerland. The conference provides various educational, informative sessions and workshops for elected officials to attend.

Council was fortunate enough to meet with four provincial cabinet ministers including the Ministries of Education, Municipal Affairs and Housing, Health, and State for Child Care and the CEO of Interior Health to look for support in principle for a collaborative proposal for a Summerland Community Health and Wellness Centre that fulfills several needs in our community. A robust community engagement process will need to be undertaken before such a project moves forward to consider and determine community needs and financial considerations.

Summerland also met with the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy regarding climate change adaption initiatives and also to request the release of helpful data more frequently and to have it accessible to local governments.

Discussions took place with the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations (FLNRO) regarding forming a pilot partnership to help streamline restoration work for private property owners (ie Eneas Creek) and the need for the Province and Municipality to assist with mitigation and recovery efforts for owners affected by emergency events.

At a meeting with staff from the Minister of Agriculture, Council spoke about their proposal to facilitate a regional South Okanagan Food Innovation Hub in Summerland and requested support for funding from the province. This has been a priority for Council over the past year and the project is moving forward looking for stakeholders for a facility to help the agri-food sector to grow and develop.

Age-Friendly Summerland

Council is committed to strengthening and supporting healthy living for all of our residents. The District is developing a plan to become an age-friendly community and would like to hear from everyone, young and elderly, about what makes Summerland a great place to age and what improvements are needed to support healthy aging. This plan will not only improve quality of life for seniors, but all ages will enjoy a more inclusive, safe and accessible community.

A survey is available from Oct. 1 - 15 and will cover topics such as housing, transportation, outdoor spaces, community services and social inclusion. It can be accessed electronically at www.summerland.ca (front page) or paper copies are available at Municipal Hall.

An Age-Friendly Advisory Committee has been established to understand what residents want and need to become an age-friendly community; and with the help of a consultant will put together an assessment and recommendations for implementation.

Biosolid compost is valued for its high organic matter content and strong structure that drains easily and promotes healthy root growth. The Class A government designation means that the product can be sold with no restrictions. It can be safely applied to lawns, flowers, shrubs and gardens.

Applying District of Summerland Compost in the fall will prepare your yard for next year – replenishing the nutrients lost during the growing season!

- Restore Lawns;
- Overwinter Trees and Shrubs;
- Plant Fall Bulbs and Tubers;
- Re-nourish Spent Gardens.

District of Summerland Compost is available for purchase from the Summerland Landfill. Please bring your own containers/bags and shovel for small quantities or we can load trucks and trailers Monday- Friday from 9:00am-2:45pm, with a closure between 12:00-12:30 for staff lunch.

The landfill also has green wood mulch, white wood/aple box mulch and top dressing for sale.

Irrigation Turn Off Starts Oct. 7. If you require an extension, visit Municipal Hall before then.

| Energy Saving Heating Tips

- Place area rugs on cold floors.
- Place insulators behind cover plates to prevent air loss.
- Put on a sweater rather than turning up the thermostat.




- On sunny winter days, open south facing blinds and drapes.
 - At night turn down the thermostat.
 You could save 2% on your heating bill for every 1°C you turn down the thermostat.
- When landscaping evergreens, like pine or fir, planting on the north side of your home will provide an energy-saving windbreak.
- Adding insulation to your attic and basement tend to give the biggest energy savings.
- Break out the caulking, air leakage represents 25% to 35% of the heat lost in an older home.
- Weather stripping and sealants will stop drafts, improve comfort and protect the structure.
- If replacing your furnace, choose a qualified ENERGY STAR® model. ENERGY STAR® qualified furnaces have annual fuel utilization efficiency (AFUE) ratings of 83% and 90%, or higher, making them up to 15% more efficient than standard models.
- Choose ENERGY STAR® qualified windows when replacing or adding windows to your home.
