Toyokoro Sister City Trip

Mayor Boot, along with the Sister City delegation which included Summerland's Royalty, travelled to Toyokoro, Japan, Summerland's Sister City. Toyokoro has been Summerland's Sister City for 23 years.



Toyokoro is located on the island of Hokkaido, the northernmost and second largest island in Japan. With a population of 3000, they are much smaller than Summerland but they have a very large agricultural economy which makes them similar to Summerland.

The delegation participated and attended many interesting cultural events and toured different venues. Mayor Boot and Mayor Miyaguchi had an opportunity to visit and discuss many topics including how local governments operate and the future of the Sister City relationship. Toyokoro installed a substantial solar array a few minutes from their City Hall. Mayor Boot was able to ask questions and get information pertaining to their solar array which generates enough energy to power 8200 households each year.



Going forward, Mayor Boot sees value in a cultural exchange program for our youth and will discuss with Council further how this relationship may evolve.

Lakeshore Paths and Trails

Some areas that were damaged along the shores of Okanagan Lake from the 2017 flooding may see repair work starting this month. Contract award recommendations for Powell Beach and the James & Mary Gartrell Trail will be going to council for approval on September 9. If approved, construction will begin in September and is expected to be completed by the end of November.

The other damaged areas, such as the pathways at Peach Orchard Beach / Rotary Beach and a section of Lakeshore Drive North, will likely be repaired in the spring of 2020. The District is working through the land tenure application and environmental approval processes for these locations.

BC Transit Information - Bus Changes in September

Effective September 3, 2019 schedule changes for the South Okanagan-Similkameen Transit System will be implemented.

Changes include the addition of a new Route 70 Penticton/Kelowna bus with details as follows:

- Two round trips at commuter times every weekday
- Two additional midday round trips on Mondays to improve connections to other areas within the South Okanagan-Similkameen Region
- Fares are \$5 per one way trip and monthly passes are available
- Route 70 replaces the existing Route 60 Kelowna

There are some slight changes to the arrival and departure times of the south and northbound buses for Route 30 Summerland/Penticton bus as well. Please check <u>https://www.bctransit.com/south-okanagan-similkameen/schedules-and-maps/riders-guide</u> or the bus for details.

Bus Stop Info

While Wharton Street is closed, the bus stops have been temporarily moved to Main street between Lordco and the highschool; the curb has been painted red and there is NO PARKING along the temporary stops while Wharton is closed.

The Northbound Kelowna bus stop on Peach Orchard Road is in front of the Harold Simpson Youth Centre and has resulted in the removal of 3 parking stalls on the south side of the street.

There are 10 park-and-ride stalls designated on the western side of the arena parking lot, identified by red painted lines. It is a short walk from these stalls to the bus stop on Peach Orchard Road.



Back to School Time The maximum speed limit on school days in a School Zone is 30 km/h from 8am-5pm. The Summerland RCMP and Citizens on Patrol volunteers will be focusing on school zones this September to ensure drivers are slowing down.

The fine for speeding in a school zone is either \$196.00 or \$253.00 depending on your speed.

Speeding in excess of 70km/h could result in even higher fines and having your vehicle impounded. Please be mindful of our children heading to and from school on crosswalks, roads and roundabouts.
