

Parks & Recreation COVID-19 SAFETY PLAN OUTDOOR SPACES – USER GROUPS

April 7, 2021 v5 subject to change

The District of Summerland owns a variety of outdoor recreation spaces including parks, beaches, sport fields, playgrounds, sport courts, natural areas, public washroom buildings, special purpose parks and various amenities.

The District of Summerland is committed to adapting parks and recreation opportunities which align with <u>BC's Restart Plan</u> and the Provincial Health Office (PHO) guidelines and directives.

The District of Summerland responded to direction from our public health officials to close facilities and many of outdoor spaces as well as ceasing services in March 2020. The District is now responding to the direction to reopen our facilities and offer services to our community cautiously, with the safety of staff and community being the priority. The <u>BCRPA Guideline for Restarting Recreation</u> provides the District with a framework to apply to the provision of recreation and parks services during the pandemic.

This document is intended to provide user groups of outdoor spaces an understanding of the District of Summerland's protocols and the requirements of the user groups who are booking parks or outdoor facilities.

DISTRICT OF SUMMERLAND PROTOCOLS

The District of Summerland is responsible to:

- 1. Complete a Facility Assessment of outdoor spaces prior to opening the spaces up for rental opportunities.
- 2. Place signage at outdoor spaces outlining COVID-19 expectations from the public.
- 3. Update rental agreement terms and conditions for user group bookings with COVID-19 information as recommended by the Municipal Insurance Association of BC.
- 4. Ensure all user groups have completed a rental agreement and provided required documents including comprehensive liability insurance prior to permitting use of the outdoor space for organized activity.
- 5. Ensure all user groups have completed a COVID-19 Safety Plan.
- 6. Create a Parks & Recreation COVID-19 Safety Plan.
- 7. Provide site specific COVID-19 Facility Guidelines where applicable.

USER GROUP REQUIREMENTS

The user groups are responsible to:

- 1. User groups are required to comply with the PHO Order for <u>Gatherings and Events</u> and <u>Province-wide Restrictions</u> and monitor regularly for updates.
- 2. Following the recent changes from the Provincial Health Officer, **wearing masks are required** in District of Summerland facilities (including washrooms).
- 3. Provide a COVID-19 Safety Plan which clearly demonstrates how activities will be provided to align with the directives of the Provincial Health Office, local authorities, and other relevant regulators (IE WorkSafeBC). The Safety Plan must identify who will be responsible for ensuring compliance within the user group. The Safety Plan must be posted by the organization and/or available on-site during activities.
- 4. Sport organizations must review the <u>viaSport Return to Sport Guidelines</u> and their Provincial Sport Organization Return to Sport Guidelines and develop a COVID-19 Safety Plan specific to their sport and the facility they are operating out of. The Safety Plan must be approved by their local board of directors and submitted to the District of Summerland. For sport user groups who do not have a board of directors, the Safety Plan must be submitted and approved by the rental applicant. Sports Organizations or bookings without a PSO may use the BCRPA Template for Non-Affiliated Sport Groups as a guide.
- 5. Non-sport user groups are required to provide COVID-19 Safety Plan approved by the organization's board of directors and submitted to the District of Summerland. For user groups who do not have a board of directors, the Safety Plan must be submitted and approved by the rental applicant. The BCRPA Template for Activity Groups may be used as a guide.
- 6. No spectators are allowed at any sport activities under the current Order. The only people allowed to attend sport activities are those that provide care to a participant or player. For example, providing first aid.
- No travel from other communities to participate in sport unless it is the home club. See <u>viaSport</u> <u>Travel for Sport</u> details on this.
- For <u>youth</u> sport groups no bookings or gatherings of over 50 people. For <u>adult</u> sport groups no booking or gatherings of over 10 people. In both cases, participants must maintain a distance of <u>3 metres</u> from one another unless everyone lives in the same private residence. Games, tournaments and competitions are temporarily suspended for teams. Individual drills and modified training activities can continue. No spectators are permitted.
- 9. Outdoor user groups who require access to park buildings will need to include COIVID-19 protocols in their Safety Plan around use of the building(s).

- 10. Users groups are responsible to ensure that all participants are aware and are complying to the user group's COVID-19 Safety Plan and all District of Summerland COVID-19 related Plans, Policies and Procedures which can be found on the <u>District's website</u>. User groups must have a COVID-19 Ambassador to ensure the guidelines are being followed while on District property.
- 11. Complete a rental agreement with the District of Summerland and provide all required documents including comprehensive liability insurance prior to utilizing the outdoor space for organized activity.
- 12. Ensure the COVID-19 Addendum to rental agreement is read carefully and shared with your participants.
- 13. Contact tracing is required for each booking session. Names and contact information for all attendees, volunteers, staff and organizers must be recorded and retained by the organizer for 30 days following the booking/event.
- 14. Must review and adhere to site specific COVID-19 Facility Guidelines.

COVID-19 SAFETY PLANS


The purpose of Safety Plans is to identify the specific control measures that will be taken in order to mitigate the risk of virus transmission, the party responsible for ensuring compliance within the user group, and include but is not limited to, a plan on managing physical distancing, common touch areas, and flow of participants.

The Province has highlighted 5 principles for every situation in the <u>BC Restart Plan</u>:

Five Principles For Every Situation

The Restart Plan also includes the hierarchy of controls for COVID-19 which are fundamental to the information the recreation sector needs to restart operations:



The <u>BCRPA Guideline for Restarting Recreation</u> provides a checklist outlining considerations for user groups:

Frequent Hand Hygiene	Procedures to promote hand hygiene, including advising users to wash hands before arrival and after play, to provide personal hand sanitizer.

Gatherings (group size determined	Confirmation of adherence to facility use area(s) maximum	
by physical distancing requirement)	participant count for space being used.	
Participants Who Are III	Process for advising participants in advance about personal health and addressing individuals exhibiting signs of illness on site.	
Sharing of Equipment	Procedures for managing equipment needs for participants to avoid sharing of items.	
Communication Plan	Evidence of communications to employees, volunteers, and participants to reinforce safety control measures.	
Training of Employees/Volunteers	Evidence of training for individuals leading or supporting activities, per industry requirements (ie WorkSafeBC, etc) New coaching/instructor guidelines.	
Emergency Procedures	Updated procedures for first aid, medical assistance, PPE supplies, and protocol response to cases or outbreaks.
