Updated Dog Park Designs, Fall 2020

To minimize unneeded initial expense, this is the minimum required infrastructure we feel is necessary to implement a successful Dog Park: (in order of priority)

- Full Fencing
- Maximum usable available space for play (ball throwing, running)
- Double Gates (Self closing/latching)
- Garbage bins (regular type)
- Asphalt entrance pad
- Designated handicap parking
- Supplemental Lighting
- Waste Bag dispensers
- Auto Shutoff Water faucet (Dogs only)
- Hard-pack gravel pathways
- Signage (information, policies, contacts)

As resources permit, the following upgrades/amenities may also be considered either in the initial design, or as upgrades later: (in order of priority)

- Shade Structures & seating
- Concrete entrance pad
- Asphalt pathways
- Additional landscaping (Sod, shade tree, decorative)
- Improved Bear-proof garbage bins
- Auto Shutoff Water fountain (Drinkable)
- Washrooms
- Fenced off training area
- Privacy Screening (Exception: will be required for Powell tennis courts)
- Stimulation structures (rocks, artificial landscapes, agility toys)
- WiFi service

Maintenance access gates subject to change, should be placed at optimal locations as determined by staff. We would also encourage that accessible pathways be considered for easier access to shaded and sensory areas of the park. Note that all layouts provided are draft concepts only. A proper in-field survey should be conducted by a qualified professional prior to final design and construction.
