


#### Context


The District of Summerland is in the process of replacing the existing pier at Gordon Beggs Rotary Beach, which had to be removed for safety reasons. In line with the Waterfront Concept Plan, the District has confirmed funding to construct the basic concept estimated at approximately \$800,000 through the Growing Communities Fund.

Between August 9 and September 4, 2023, a survey was launched to help the District understand the community's interests in additional features that could be added as enhancements to the basic pier replacement. The survey received 597 responses. The following presentation summarizes the results.






## **Option Preference**




Theme	Count
Simplicity and costs (66 comments)	<ul> <li>Keep the design simple (46)</li> <li>Concerns with high costs of features (12)</li> <li>Replace with the same design (8)</li> </ul>
Features (54 comments)	<ul> <li>Support for shade structure (7) / oppose shade structure (3)</li> <li>Support additional lighting (8) and seating (8)</li> <li>Support rope swing (7)</li> <li>Support for features that enhance swimming (6), separate the swimming area from boats (4) and add a diving board (3)</li> <li>Add a zipline (4)</li> <li>Support for the stairs (4)</li> </ul>
Design (40 comments)	<ul> <li>Design with kids in mind (14)</li> <li>Ensure the design is safe (safety features, lifeguard) (12)</li> <li>Ensure design is accessible for all mobility needs (11) and seniors (3)</li> </ul>
