Victoria Road Project Completed: Supporting Stronger Infrastructure, Safer Travel, and a Growing Community

SUMMERLAND – The District of Summerland is pleased to announce the successful completion of the Victoria Road Improvements Project, extending from Dunham Crescent to Prairie Valley Road. This major infrastructure investment strengthens transportation and water systems while supporting safer travel and the needs of Summerland’s growing community.

Completed improvements include:

- Upgrades to the watermain system to support long-term water system separation and reliability;
- Road improvements and multi-use pathway network extension north along Victoria Road to the Prairie Valley Road roundabout;
- Pedestrian safety enhancements and a multi-use pathway along Dale Meadows Road to improve access to the sports fields;
- Additional crosswalks and intersection safety improvements.

The total project budget was \$3,881,000, made possible through significant funding support from provincial programs and partners, including:

- Up to \$1,000,000 in matching funds from the Ministry of Agriculture and Food’s Agriculture Water Infrastructure Program, delivered by Investment Agriculture Foundation (IAF) for water infrastructure upgrades;
- \$500,000 from the B.C. Active Transportation Infrastructure Grants Program for the multi-use pathway extension;
- \$31,000 from ICBC for road safety improvements.

The District gratefully acknowledges the financial support of the Province of British Columbia and the Investment Agriculture Foundation for their contributions to this important initiative.

Investing in Critical Water Infrastructure

The water infrastructure component of the project supports efforts to maximize water availability for agricultural uses, particularly irrigation, in a water-scarce and drought-prone region of the Okanagan increasingly impacted by climate change.

The completed upgrades will:

- Advance the system separation works identified in the Water Master Plan;
- Move the District one step closer to demand reduction on the water treatment plant during peak summer periods and increase irrigation water availability for agricultural operations;
- Support tree fruit production and help meet growing agricultural water demands.

These infrastructure investments improve the reliability and long-term sustainability of Summerland’s water system while helping prepare the community for future growth.

Enhancing Road Safety and Active Transportation

The Victoria Road corridor upgrades also improve safety and accessibility for all road users. Approximately 700 metres of new multi-use pathway have been added to Summerland’s active transportation network.

Intersections along Victoria Road, including Dale Meadows Road and Beavis Place, were redesigned to help reduce traffic speeds and shorten pedestrian crossing distances, creating a safer environment for pedestrians and cyclists.

These improvements support safer and more connected travel options for residents and visitors while strengthening essential infrastructure across the community.
